Judas' Failed Plan by Pastor Stephen Harrison

When you think about the twelve disciples, which one comes to mind as the villain of the bunch? Judas, right? We see him as the one wearing all black while all the other disciples wore white. Seemingly, Judas was just like the other disciples. He was chosen by Jesus (although he appears last in every list in the Bible). He looked good on the outside, traveling with Jesus for three years. He even appeared to care for the poor as he questioned the motives of those who anointed Jesus' feet with a costly jar of perfume valued at a year's wages. He wanted to give it to the poor but John, in retrospect, reveals that Judas only wanted to line his own pockets with the proceeds of the ministry (John 12:1-6).

Judas Iscariot was a great actor. He appeared to be a devout and upright man who followed Jesus. Although chosen by Jesus personally, he would soon betray Jesus for a measly thirty pieces of silver (valued at 20-30 dollars). It is interesting that all Judas could get in his negotiations with the Sanhedrin was the lowest of the low price of a slave (Exodus 21:32). While they hated Jesus, the Sanhedrin had no respect for Judas who sold out the very one he claimed to follow. At least they did not hide their hate for Jesus with hypocrisy. Judas sold Jesus out with an ironic kiss (Matthew 26:48-49). A kiss was meant to signify love and devotion but Judas repeatedly used it as an act of betrayal. Jesus still called him friend.

Judas started out like all the other disciples but his life was never transformed by Jesus. If so, he would have repented for thoughts of betrayal, as he had several opportunities. Judas was greedy. His devious and deliberate plan of betrayal was premeditated. Months of planning, waiting for the opportune hour to strike was his game. He stole from the disciples' treasury all along and was now trying to cash in one last time. He was a coward, as he tried to betray Jesus "In the absence of the multitude" (Luke 22:6). Judas was looking for the door to hell most convenient for him. While Judas' name meant "Jehovah Leads", this son of perdition was led only by his wicked, hypocritical, heinous plan to get rich. There are two in Scripture called "son of perdition". Judas (John 17:12) and the Antichrist (2 Thessalonians 2:3). Truly, he did not belong to Jesus, as he never called Him Lord like the other disciples.

Judas made the wrong choice, selling Jesus out for chump change, as exactly predicted in Zechariah 11:12-13. How could a man who was exposed to so much truth, love, and the very Son of God do this? He had heard Jesus preach the Sermon on the Mount, walk on water, raise Lazarus from the dead, feed thousands with little, and heal the blind. Judas had an outward association with Jesus but his heart was void of Christ. Trying to become rich, he died poor, falling headlong after a failed self-hanging attempt in a field bought for the burial of the poor with the very money he used to betray Jesus. What a waste. He traded eternal life for fleeting earthly riches. Judas, in the end, sold himself out, not Jesus.
